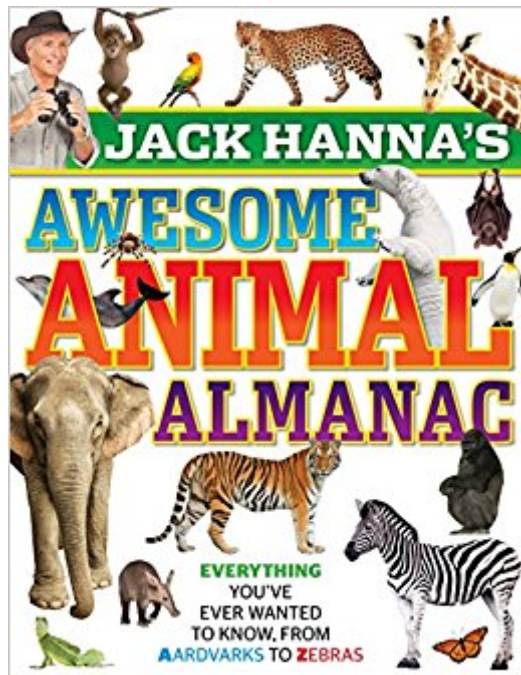




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Jack Hanna's Awesome Animal Almanac

I got this book for my toddler who (at the moment) is at the height of her animal obsession. Considering it's from animal expert/living legend Jack Hanna, I figured it'd be a great book, and I was pleasantly surprised. While my toddler loves looking at all the animals she knows, she's also learning all new animals (she really thought the Walking Stick was hilarious). Although she's not at the right age for the categories (I

didn't think it would be so hard to explain bipedal to a 3-year-old) but she'll grow into more curiosity and this book will be a great companion in animal 101. The blurbs are brief and great for my kid's attention span, and they each dole out a nice little tidbit, no different than what Hanna would say about a particular animal while on The Tonight Show. Fun book!

I used to live near Columbus, Ohio, so was always a big Jack Hanna fan. I spotted this book at a friend's place and he mentioned how much his kids liked it. I decided to get a copy for my daughter and I have to say it's a beautiful book. It's packed with super high quality color images and lots of facts about different types of animals. The book is divided into A to Z sections with each section devoted to a different animal characteristic (predator, venomous, etc). Each section highlights a dozen or so relevant animals, with a few facts about each one. As noted, the photography is what makes this book stand out. Even the inside covers are printed with macro photographs of animal fur and feathers. I think it would be perfect for any kid who loves looking at cool pictures of animals, while learning a few things about them at the same time. The text isn't terribly extensive, but I think that's okay, so long as it keeps my kids entertained. For the record, my daughter thinks the book is indeed "awesome."

I love this book (and so do my niece and nephew)! It's incredibly informative with tons of facts packed on every page, making it highly educational for an independent reader, and the photos are big and bold and fun, which makes it a great introduction to animals for a younger reader who needs a little help and just likes pretty pictures of lions or tigers or bears (oh my!). I've been obsessed with Jack Hanna since I was a kid and I'm so excited I can share his knowledge, experience and humor with my niece and nephew, both budding zoologists. It's comprehensive without being overwhelming and even I learned a lot of stuff I never knew. Plus, the price is right! Buy this book. The title says it all - it's awesome!
