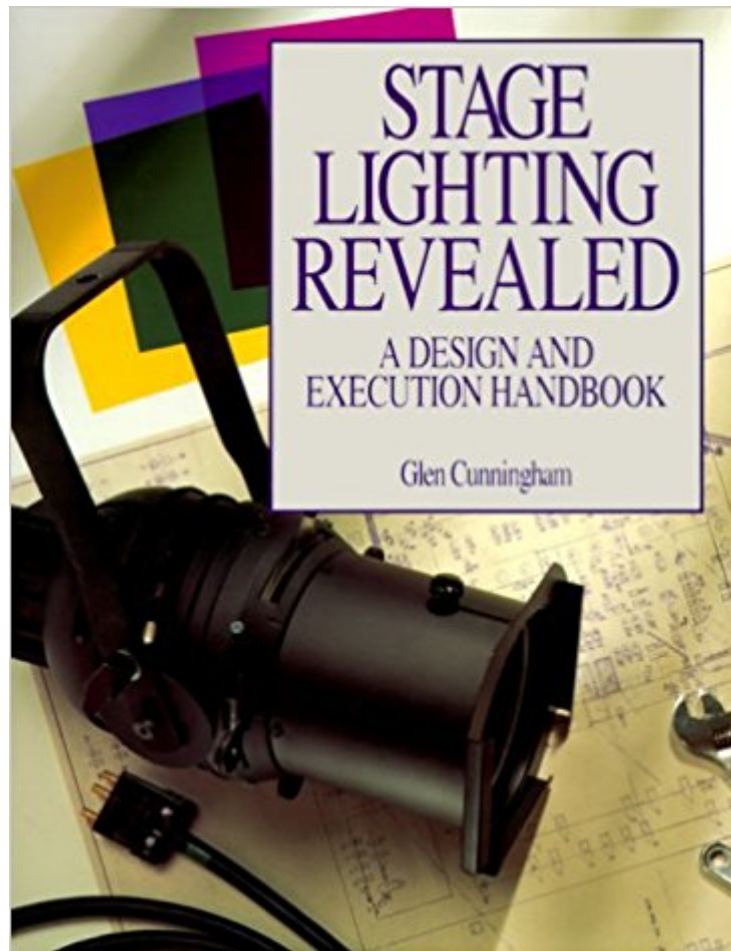




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Stage Lighting Revealed: A Design And Execution Handbook

The book is divided into three parts: design, equipment selection, and lighting the show. Each section covers all aspects of the subject, from artistic considerations to technical concerns. The jargon of the profession is defined, and commonly used procedures are explained in detail. Eight useful appendixes cover such topics as symbols, wiring diagrams, gel comparisons and descriptions, and troubleshooting. Black-and-white photographs, drawings, and charts appear throughout, providing excellent graphic explanations of the topic. This is an excellent good introduction with some flaws.First, the strengths:- One of the better

explanations of the process of designing a show that I've seen. Very concise overview. Not as detailed as some other treatments but still a good overview.- Good overview of the equipment available at the time of publication (important qualification)- Paperwork discussion's good, if a bit out of dateMy big gripe is that this book was published in the early 90's (the 2002 date is a reissue date) and obviously hasn't been updated. For example, it assumes that shows are still saved on floppies, some boards are still analog (can't for the life of me imagine what could possess you to do that) and, from what I can gather, not all digital boards at the time he was writing were even DMX compliant. As a result, there's no discussion of modern intelligent fixtures, moving lights, LEDs, Ethernet-based devices, or other recent innovations. It also assumes that computer-based drafting systems are about the cost of a car (and less portable), so it doesn't talk much about them. (I had to learn hand-drafting in college; the only reason I can imagine learning it now is if you ever have to work for a theater company that still insists on it for some bizarre reason, but I honestly can't think of a good reason to hand-draft anymore). Also, it lacks color illustrations, which I think are an oversight for a lighting design book. In spite of the weaknesses, I would definitely recommend this. It's an excellent overview of the process and basic equipment (which is still in use), as long as you keep in mind you'll have to supplement it with information on new equipment.

This is a must have for learning about the basics of stage lighting. I know of a professor who uses this book to teach his classes about stage lighting. Haven't made it through the whole book yet, but it has been a valuable resource with lots of information and drawings.

While this is an excellent primer for the beginner, DON'T LET 'S PUBLISHED DATE FOOL YOU. This book was WRITTEN IN 1993 and does not cover computerized lighting nor does it cover the new and widely used fixtures on the market today. should have alerted the reader that the book was re-issued but NOT updated when it changed publishers. The July 2002 date is the DATE THE BOOK CHANGED PUBLISHERS ONLY. It has not been updated since 1993. It is identical to my 1993 copy, and only the cover has been changed. Sad.....Without extensive chapters on computerized consoles and dimming systems, moving lights, and new fixtures (those new in the last 14 years), the beginner can only go so far. Disappointing in an otherwise excellent text.

It covers everything from the fundamentals of electricity to state-of-the-art equipment. It would be nice if it had a bit more information on specific lighting techniques, but with the amount of clear, practical information in this book, I can't complain. A perfect book for beginners and intermediate designers alike.
