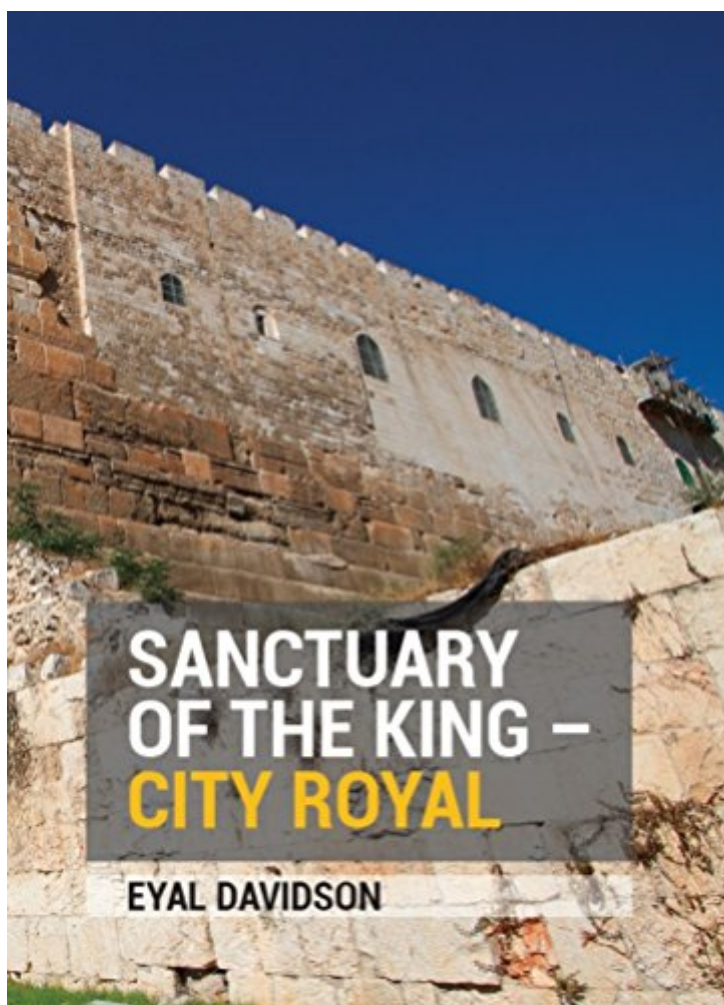


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Sanctuary Of The King – City Royal: 13 Tours Of Jerusalem
