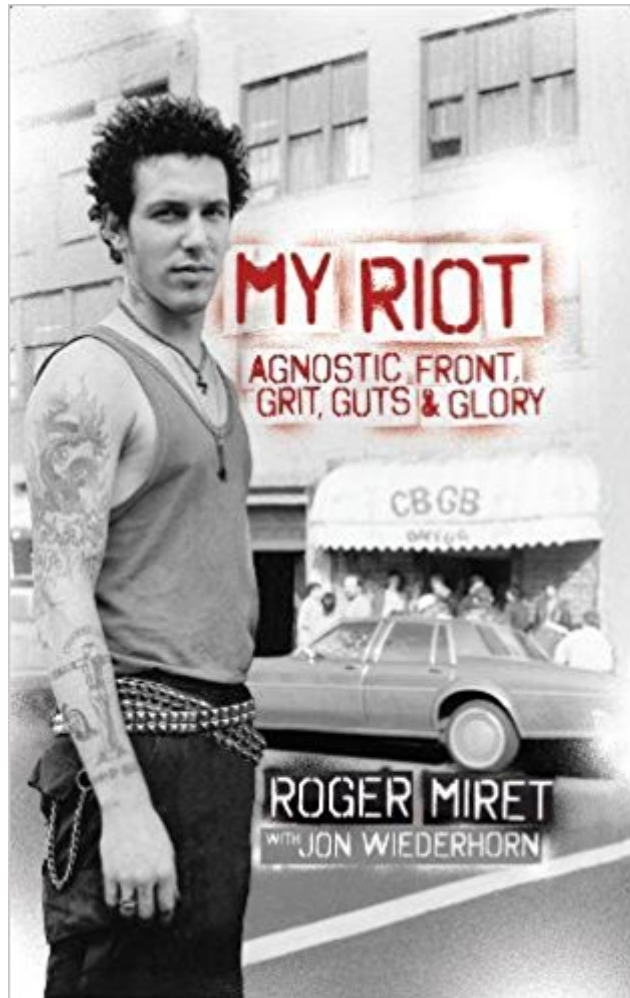

NOW THIS was a pretty good read. As a book, it's all over the place but the good stories and content override a fair amount of erratic storytelling. Like his childhood friend from Cro-Mags, Harley Flanagan, Roger Miret had a very (to put it mildly) difficult and traumatic upbringing.... abuse being the cherry on top of being a poor refugee from Cuba. He didn't make a whole lot of good choices, dropping out of school, living in squalor until he was a young adult and running drugs from Florida up to NY. All this while, he is making music, and creating history with his band Agnostic Front. Wild Stories for sure! The book finishes with Roger working as an electrician, living with his wife and two young children in Arizona and occasionally touring with AF (if I read the calendar right, they are currently on tour). While Roger definitely comes off as a drug addled anti-hero in his youth, his later life shows some redemption, some consideration of his actions and a wish to make the world a better place. Not sure about the rest of the readers out there, but I was cheering Roger Miret on by the end of the book and hope to get it autographed some day.

It is so cliché to say I could not put the book down, but that is exactly how I felt about Roger Miret's book, "My Riot". This is a must read for any AF fan and/or NYHC, or music fan in general. Roger

Being involved in the New York Hardcore scene as a fan and concert-goer since 1985, I was familiar with some of Roger Miret's history with Agnostic Front. I have followed the band religiously since '85 and heard many stories about the infamous AF back then and stories about the NYHC scene before my time. Some proved to be the truth, some half-truths, and others were out-and-out bull, but that's expected with tales revolving around one of the most popular and respected hardcore bands on the planet. None of what I knew or what I heard could have prepared me for *My Riot*. Roger Miret delves in deep and in great detail about all aspects of his life - his tumultuous and often violent family situation during his childhood and early teens, his discovery of punk and his eventual involvement in the defining the fledgling NYHC scene when he joined Agnostic Front and they recorded the *United Blood* EP, his struggle to provide for his wife and daughter while living in dangerous squats and streets of New York City, his time in jail, the ups and downs with Agnostic Front, and many more facets of his life. Miret unveils his most personal accounts in a way that is brutally honest, yet not over embellished. There are plenty of holy-s*** stories in his book, but they don't read like a bloated, over-the-top script about New York fictional characters. To me, some parts of the book are written with a hint of detachment, but I don't believe Roger is unapologetic or making light of his tumultuous early-life choices and the ensued consequences. It's his way of speaking and if anyone has ever met him, they will understand what I'm talking about. It's honest story-telling without the bells and whistles. It suits his character. Roger's life story is so captivating, there is no need to scream it. He had my attention from page one to the epilogue. I devoured this book into settings of about 4 hours each. I am sure many fans will have the same experience of reading it quickly and then going back and reading it again. It is that good!

If there is any justice in this world this book will receive high praise and wide recognition. So well written and insightful and some of the greatest "street" stories I've ever read, (fiction and non

fiction). I want to re read it and highlight the brilliant sentences he uses to summarize what he has learned from the brutality of his existence. Truly triumphant. I hope Roger makes a ton of money from this book.

A must have book if you grew up listening to hardcore music, the trials and tribulations and sacrifices that it took to become one of the iconic bands of NYHC or Hardcore punk period. If you've ever wondered about the back story of one of the toughest bands to come off the streets of the Lower East side and their singer this is it.
