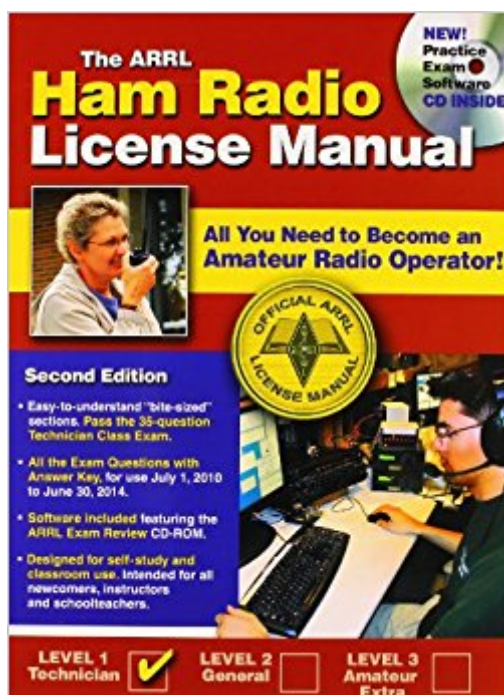


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Ham Radio License Manual With CD (Arrl Ham Radio License Manual)

NB: The exam questions covered in this edition expired in July, 2014. Be sure to get the new (3rd) edition!!!! Since the telegraphy requirement was dropped (in 2000 for the Technican class license and in 2007 for all licenses)---the only thing that stands between you and an amateur radio license

is a 35-question, multiple choice exam. The exam questions are drawn from a pool of over 350 prospective questions in the following areas: T1 FCC Rules T2 Operating Procedures T3 Radio Wave Characteristics and Propagation T4 Amateur Radio Practices T5 Electrical Principles T6 Electrical components, semiconductors, circuit diagrams, component functions T7 Station equipment T8 Modulation modes, amateur satellite operations, operating activities, non-voice communications T9 Antennas and feedlines T0 Safety A technical whiz can breeze through T5 and T6--but other sections deal with law (T1) and common operating practices (T2)--details that cannot be deduced from fundamental principles...so virtually everyone is going to need to bone up on some of the material to successfully pass the exam. This book is terrific. It contains all of the questions (and answers) in the current pool (valid until June 2014). The book is logically organized to walk through the various relevant aspects of amateur radio and along the way provides detailed answers to every question in the pool. Also included is a chapter offering guidance on setting up your first station. As a bonus, there is a CD ROM with a Windows Application that will generate sample exams or will let you work your way through all of the questions in the pool providing instant feedback (including background material). A terrific book that covers the subject admirably.

I was always interested in radio and decided to delve into the world of Ham Radio, so I did some research and all pointed to this manual by the ARRL. It was easy to read and understand. I studied using the questions in the book and some online testing recommended in the book. I found a local Ham Radio club and found out that they were offering testing at an annual Ham Fest they were hosting so I signed up. I took the test and passed on my first try. One of the VEC's that gave me the good news said that I should try the General Class test since I did so good on the Technician test but I wimped out because this was really all new to me. I have had my Technician license now for 4 years and have pulled the trigger once again and now will be studying for my General license to take in August. I recommend this book for all those interested in the hobby and maybe just wanting to get their feet wet in Ham Radio. It was a real asset to me and I still look through it as a reference from time to time. If you do decide to buy a manual make sure that you get the latest version as they change the question bank every five years. An excellent book for those who are studying for the Tech license examination, but be sure to buy the latest edition of the book so that you're seeing the revised list of questions that appear on the current version of the exam, as the question pool is revised every four years. Note that while all of

the questions and answers for the three different amateur radio license classes are freely available on the Internet, some prefer to study from a hardcopy book; if so, then this is for you.

I used this book (and only this book) to prepare for the Ham Radio Technician exam and passed successfully (100%). The book is very methodical and thorough and explains not only what you need to know for the exam but gives you a little more information to better understand the topics. Every section of the book references the questions it addresses and I must agree, it is not the most convenient way since the questions in the appendix are not in the order as they are listed in the text. Regardless, once you study the book you'll know more than is needed to pass the technician exam and to get your license. Also, keep in mind that the questions get updated every few years and you need to get the latest version of the book, otherwise the question pool for the exam will be different. Good luck.

I ordered and received this book only to find that the question pool expires in 1 month. Every 4 years the fcc changes the question pool, and as of 6/1/2014 this study guide is outdated. Buyer Beware! Also, the enclosed CD wouldn't allow me access to practice tests, I am highly disappointed that I would be charged this kind of price for an outdated manual! Again, let the Buyer Beware

This book contains all the information needed to pass the test. I read the text portion twice over a couple of months. I got through about 70% of the questions in the last half before taking the test. I barely passed, but that was good enough to get the license. The book has two parts, half of it is the information about Ham Radio, the second half is the question bank with the answers so you can study. The questions in the book are the exact same questions that are on the test, as long as you buy the current years book. I think the questions are being updated this year, so make sure you get the most current version and don't wait too long before you take the test.

Watch what you get. The copy we received covers exam information from 2010 to 2014. Not much good for 2017

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
