

This book is a very good look at a remarkable approach to conducting counter-insurgency operations. While in some ways specific to the particular place and time of Rhodesia in the 1970s, anyone with a professional or personal interest in how military COIN operations and strategies should give this book a look, if you can bear the cost of finding it used. Besides being a fascinating read, it is also very much a page-turner sort of good read. The one critique I might offer is that a reader would benefit from a good understanding of the political situation in Rhodesia, Mozambique, and elsewhere in southern Africa at the time, though this is certainly not an absolute requisite, and the details a reader may not understand are not central to the narrative of the Selous Scouts' operations and exploits.
