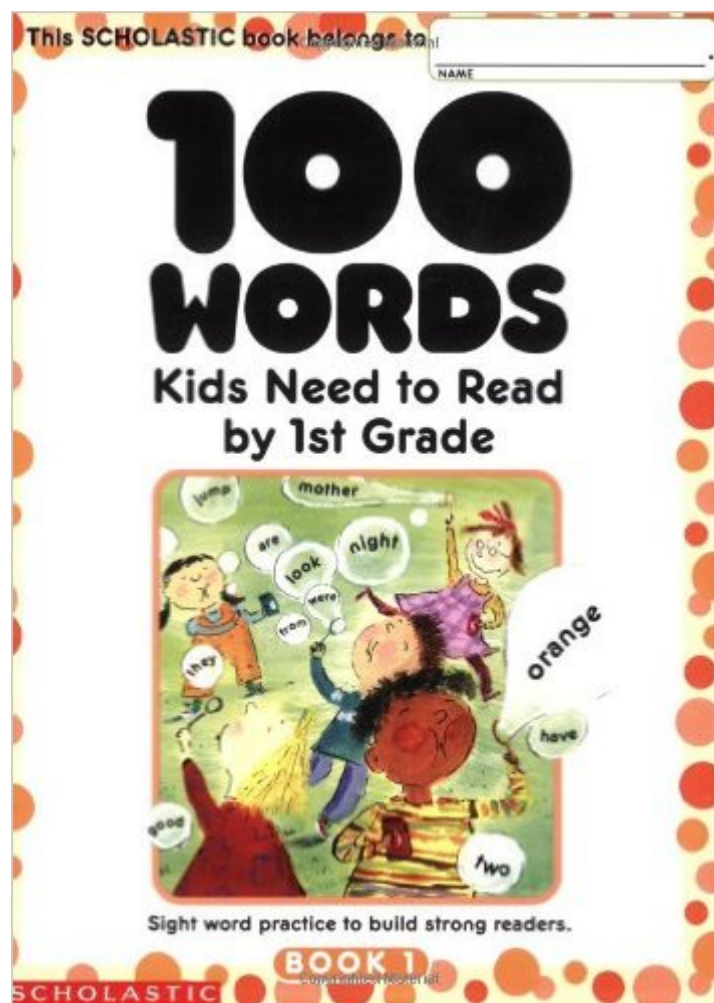

I really like this book. Pages are nice and colorful and look fun. I especially like the use of photography in this instead of just illustrations of cartoons like most books. Worksheets seem easy enough but also some challenging ones too. I think the book does a great job at being "fun"

This is what my daughter needed. One of my girls has just flat out rejected reading. She says it's too hard. She can't do it. She doesn't want to do it. On and on it goes. She excels in hearly every other area, but for whatever reason, reading hasn't come easy to her. Flashcards don't work for her, because she just memorizes the order of the 30 cards, knows all the words, without reading them. Shuffle the cards and it becomes a fight and she struggles.Now, we come to this book. Of course, she fought it at first, but when I had her listen to the instructions and she saw that it starts simple with concepts she can easily grasp, she was on board. She doesn't have to be forced to work

through the book. She asks to work through the book. She enjoys it and she completes tasks that have her identify words. It's very basic, but it's a beginning and gives her a fantastic sense of accomplishment. She needed encouragement and this book, with some patience on our part, has provided it. I'm so thankful for this book. "Homework" with my daughter hasn't been a fight. It's been easy and rewarding with this book as we prepare for First Grade. I trust that this positive reinforcement will help us as we head into the school. Update: My daughter is now reading and is excited by reading. Of course, a great deal of the thanks goes to her mother and her first grade teacher working with her over the last few months, but it started with this book.

I bought all three of the books in this series for a student I am going to be tutoring this summer (I will try to remember to update after having him work in them). I love the variety of activities, colors, pictures, and high interest stories in these books. The books covers not just reading sight words, but skills such as rhyming, but synonyms, antonyms, and parts of speech. They are well-rounded books! My one and only complaint is in the titles. I wish Scholastic would have chosen to say "100 Words Kids Need to Read: Level 1, Level 2, Level 3" rather than by Grade X. I am using these with a student at a 1st grade level going into 3rd grade and I hope the titles don't deter his self confidence as a reader (which he already lacks). I may just place a label or two over the grade level with his name before I introduce the books to him. The photos below are from all three books (book 1 has orange edges, book 2 green, book 3 blue).

This book has been very helpful in bringing my son up, to speed on his reading and words he should already know. I decided to make some index cards and categorize them into groups of each set of words I want him to recognize and read. Phonics is excellent but I also believe sight reading works wonders as well. My son seems to have a photographic memory and picks up on the words quickly that way. I trick him by mixing up the good words so that he is not used to the order and color of index card. This book has helped me do all of that. This book is small but mighty.
