This book is definitely a standalone BUT in my opinion reading the others books will only help you understand and love all the other characters making a recurring role even more. The series just gets better and better, and I want more (please let the next book be Hennessy!!!). Lucas and Yve have been my absolute favorite couple of the series until Bishop and Eden. WOW! He is one sexy dark alpha male. YUMMY! The chemistry between Bishop and Eden is off the charts. Eden might be a little naive, but she is not to be underestimated. I love her drive to become a strong independent person when in actuality she already is, she just needed to believe it for herself. They both have secrets they are trying to hide from until their pasts finally collide. Enjoy the ride! One of the best things about this series is the location, New Orleans. It is one of my favorite cities in the states. The way Meghan describes and uses the location as part of the story, makes me love the story even more. For me, it

Beneath These Shadows is the sixth book in the series, and I think this is her best one yet. I absolutely love Bishop and have been waiting for him since Beneath These Chains. Eden is the perfect woman for Bishop, and behind the timid girl she tries so hard not to be is a woman with an inner strength that surprises even herself. But what the two don't know is that the past that Bishop is running from is inexplicably linked with Eden. And when the past and present come back and grab hold of Eden, it's up to Bishop to lay it all on the line to get her back. Shadows is my favorite of the Beneath series and I love how it is interconnected with Meghan March's other series, the Dirty Trilogy. The sexual scenes between Bishop and Eden are smoldering and enough to cause spontaneous combustion. This book along with the rest of the series is going into my carousel of books to be read again.

Beneath These Shadows is one of those books that pulls you right into the story. I haven't read all of the other books in this series and I didn't feel like I missed out on anything, but if the rest of the series is anything like this one, I'm definitely going back and reading them all! I absolutely loved Eden and I adored how protective Bishop was of her right from the start and their chemistry was off the charts hot. "...he wouldn't be content in this life until he made me as happy as I'd made him. That the only thing he wanted was to watch me fly, so long as he could soar beside me. His words had given me hope like nothing else possibly could." There was a great storyline with some adventure and danger in the amazing setting of New Orleans's French quarter. And of course the sexy, bearded tattoo artist with a man bun heated up my kindle in a good way!

Meghan did it again! I love these characters... old and new. I don't think I could ever grow tired of their stories. I love how Meghan is able to weave all their lives together, but at the same time give the new story line its due. With each new book in this series, I think it's just not possible that I can fall any more in love with the next alpha male character, but damn if I don't every single time! Love, love, love Bishop, but Eden is equally as lovable. She is strong, but vulnerable. The perfect combination. Meghan's female characters are always smart and strong, which are attributes I always appreciate in my female characters. I know it will eventually happen, but I really never want

this series to end.

Needing to escape her life in New York, Eden Matthews takes a one-way flight to New Orleans. She arrives in the city with only her luggage. She has no hotel reservation and it's the week before Mardi Gras. It doesn't take long for her to run into a bit of trouble, but luckily she's saved by a sexy tattooed giant. Bishop is immediately intrigued by the innocent newcomer. He tries to deny her effects on him, but he can't deny his need to protect her.

What I liked: Meghan March writes some of the sexiest alpha heroes I've ever read and Bishop is no exception. She had me hooked at his description - Huge, tattooed, and sporting a man-bun. Yep, that's all I needed. This is a fast-paced read that's full of action. We can always count on Meghan to deliver squirm worthy steamy scenes. She did not disappoint. I absolutely loved the appearances from all the couples of the previous Beneath books.

What didn't work for me: I didn't connect with the heroine, Eden Matthews. I found her to be naive and immature. I really struggled with her stumbling into mishap after mishap while sight-seeing in New Orleans. After finishing the book, I get how those scenes played into the storyline. However, while reading it I was annoyed. I absolutely love New Orleans, so that's totally on me. I also struggled with both the main characters hiding behind their secrets throughout most of the story.
