

My 5 year old daughter and I love this book. Reading about the different challenges the featured

women faced and their successes have given me a chance to explain societal issues such as racism, misogyny, and the barriers these women broke through and the freedoms we enjoy due in part to their hard work. I keep emphasizing to her that obstacles can be overcome with dedication and hard work.

Awesome book! My 7 and 10 year old cousins (both girls) love to read a few each day and they talk about who's their favorite and why. It's really nice for them to see some strong female role models from the real world and the 10 year old has started talking about how she now wants to be an engineer and the 7 year old is really taking a liking to Grace the programmer (mostly because they share the same name but it's very exciting!)

I didn't before reading this, but it is a great way to learn of the importance of women in every walk of life. It is very readable and will get the point across to young listeners that women - whose names begin with one of the 26 letters - can do anything!

The book has a great mix of well-known women and some that I have never heard about before. I bought this for a 1st grader and she of course needs help reading it, but the illustrations are great and she stays engaged. The pages are quite thick and durable. I highly recommend the book.

Some of the writing is hard to read as it is over some of the darker picture and ink is black. Information is good but should be in a white area for clarity or a different color ink.

I thought i ordered the hardback but i received the paper back book but that could have been my mistake. Great quality with great women. Perfect for my daughter

I bought this book for my niece and the illustrations and descriptions in this book are beyond what I expected. There is a quote from every woman featured in the book.
