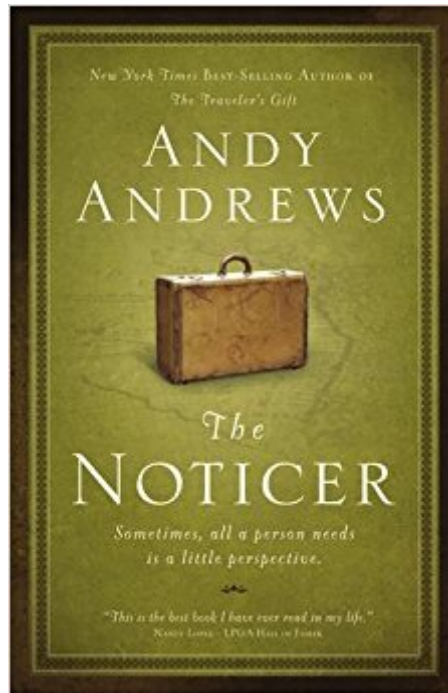


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The Noticer: Sometimes, All A Person Needs Is A Little Perspective

Bestselling inspirational writer and speaker Andrews (*The Traveler's Gift*) again blends fiction,

allegory and inspiration and seasons it with a dash of autobiography. The result is a readable little tale of a mysterious old man named Jones – just Jones, no mister – who shows up in the lives of people in crisis. Jones brings the gift of perspective – he notices alternative ways to think about things. Some of what he says is common sense: yes, sir works better than I guess. Some of what he says counters received wisdom: do sweat the small stuff, because little things can make a big difference as surely as brushstrokes make up a masterpiece. The narrator Andy is personable and appealing, and Jones is mysterious and brusque enough not to be a cloying Pollyanna.
