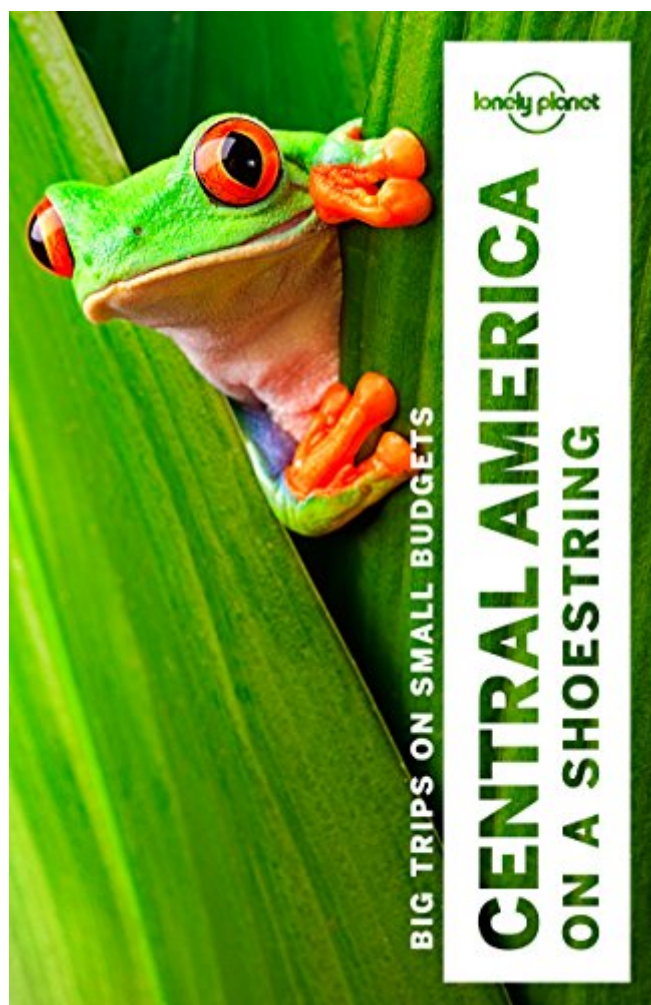

Came sooner than expected and the book is great. Very informative and helpful.

Call me crazy...but I feel like a book with "on a shoestring" in the title should really spend more time reviewing budget accommodations and skip the expensive hotels. Planning a backpacking trip to Central America and thought this would cater more to a budget traveler but really kind of disappointed. The information isn't bad, so far it mostly seems to align with what I've found online, haven't left for my trip yet though so I can't really verify that yet. Does a decent job of providing a little information about a lot of different places...CA is pretty big so expecting one book to cover everything would be unrealistic. Mostly just disappointed that more focus isn't given to true low budget options.

If you haven't decided which country(s) to go to, this book will really help you

decide based on which countries and major cities match your interests. If you only want to go to the major cities and take day trips, this may be the only guide you will need to find the list of attractions that are popular. Economical accommodations, restaurants, and transport will be very helpful along with the street maps and color photos. The first time visitor will like the information on weather, local customs, dress, and suggested itineraries. You will have the same amount of frustrations booking an escorted tour so why not go see what you really came to experience rather than what the travel company has selected for their convenience. Those who like to include off-the-beaten path travel, should consult Lonely Planet's individual country books for gems that are even better than the easily-gotten-to sites. I used them on my many trips to the region and always was thoroughly satisfied with the descriptions and details. Local transportation can easily get you there and Lonely Planet provides the departure and transit times.
