

This series is so good because Melody Carlson created interesting characters with rich values and personalities. And the historical background information is accurate and compelling. This has been added to my "favorite series" list.

I have read all the books in this series..Homeward on the Oregon Trail by Melody Carlson and thoroughly enjoyed every one of them. To me, that is unusual..all four books were of equal interest, all well written, all with great story lines, all with well developed characters! It is also unusual to be able to pick up book four to read, and remember the three former books story lines in their entirety. That speaks of a great author, and great stories. Most times, you have to have a reminder of the plot from the previous book, or a character trait from a previous book. Not so with this series..The common thread is a GOOD story with memorable characters that continues and develops into another good story in the next book. Twists, turns, clean romance without smut, and even dealing with moral issues as the story unfolds.GREAT series..you will not be disappointed. I will certainly read more by this author and highly recommend her books to all readers.
