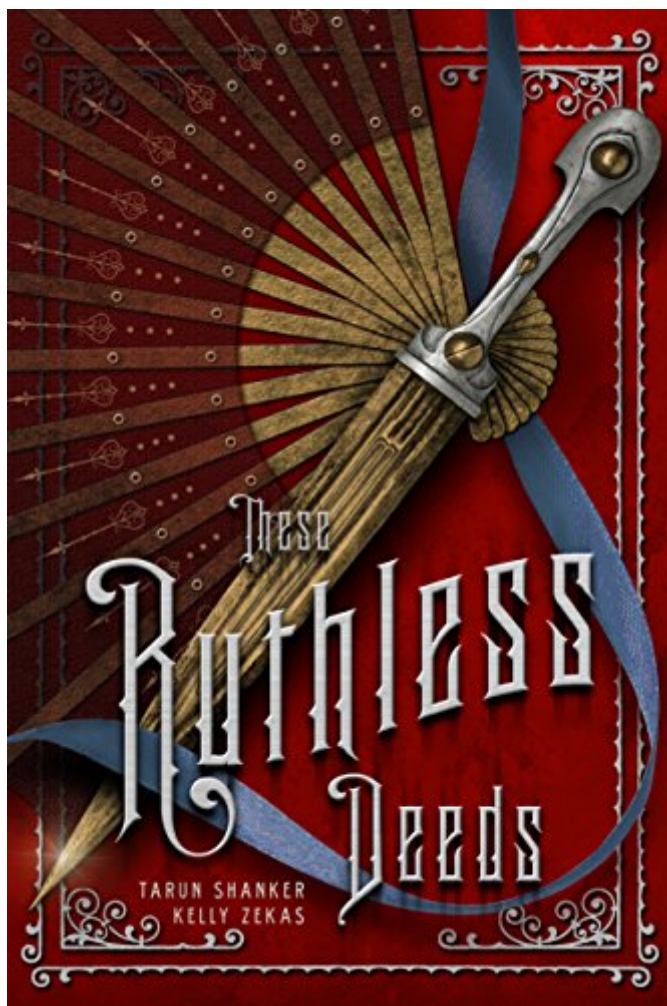


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These Ruthless Deeds (These Vicious Masks)

Things quickly intensify as Evelyn is rescued by the infamous Society of Aberrations with the help of Mr Kent. She learns that her good friend has been working with them for months.The Society attempts to recruit her group, and Evelyn can't say why, but something bothers her. She still doesn't trust them, even after all of her questions are answered truthfully with Mr Kent's power. Still, she decides to work with them for the time-being, because they can find Mr Braddock, who disappeared at the end of the first book.So the things that I liked? Well first, this book took me completely by surprise. Which is not easy. There was something tat happened that I had not expected at all. It was a gutsy move, and I respect the authors for doing it. These Ruthless Deeds is the follow up book to These Vicious Masks. The authors are forthcoming with how hard writing this second book was for them. Most authors writing a trilogy wind up making their second book as a build up for their third. Often times, the second book is lacking something. I'll be honest. These Vicious Masks was very entertaining and I fell in love with the Victorian England setting intermingled with these strong and memorable characters and plot. However, These Ruthless Deeds completely stunned me with it's awe-inspiring plot. Evelyn becomes even more fierce in her convictions in this book. With her sister's looming death, Evelyn travels down an arduous path to uncover the Society of Abberations, the organization that led the evil Dr. in book one to inadvertently kill Evelyn's sister. In the process, we see Evelyn struggle with first, the idea of joining up with them, and then trying to reason with her convictions to stay with them. The organizations liaisons do their best to convince Evelyn & co. that they stand for the protection of their kind, and in Evelyn's sister's memory, she decides to join them in order to help others like herself. However, a long the way Evelyn is faced with the true intentions of the organization and is forced to try and bring down the regime behind it. I've grown tired of the love-triangle angle in books, especially in YA. However, the love triangle between Evelyn, Sebastian, and Mr. Kent is one that I will gladly entertain. I remember being completely fond of Sebastian in book one, because I found Mr. Kent to be very pompous. However, in this book it seems to completely work for him. Zekas and Shanker did an amazing job with creating Mr. Kent's dialogue and interactions with Evelyn. He was witty, loveable, and down right loyal to a fault. When an author(s) can make me root for both suitors at the same time is when you know you have good romance writing skills. Both were viable options for Evelyn to the point where you didn't know which one she would lean towards in the end. What set this book a part and elevated it above it's predecessor in my eyes is the plot. We were introduced to some more characters with very interesting powers, and I was completely engrossed in that aspect

of the book. Things in this book get very dark compared to book one. Evelyn sees that not all gifts are a blessing like her ability to heal, and she's forced to see the true dilemma of how much damage her kind can do in the real world. There's more to life than balls, courtship, and status, whether Evelyn's mother would agree to that or not, but things get rough for our cast of characters. I want to address the ending without giving too much away. I know many see it as very controversial, considering this is a trilogy and not a duology. Zekas and Shanker made a huge choice to end *These Ruthless Deeds* the way that they did, and it will be interesting to see the ramifications come to light in the final book. *These Ruthless Deeds* does an amazing job at balancing rewarding moments and painfully devastating moments. Zekas and Shanker have mastered the push and pull of a reader's heart strings, and they are in complete control once you're pulled in. While flourishing in a Victorian England backdrop, Zekas and Shanker don't allow Evelyn to be a pawn between men. She's never objectified by her suitors because she has a sense of cogency that is admirable for both men and women alike. I look forward to reading book 3 whenever it comes out.

I didn't think I could love the second book in this series more than I loved the first book but I did! This was just everything I hoped for and more. Every character is well written and interesting. I liked that new characters were introduced in this second book and they all have unique powers.
