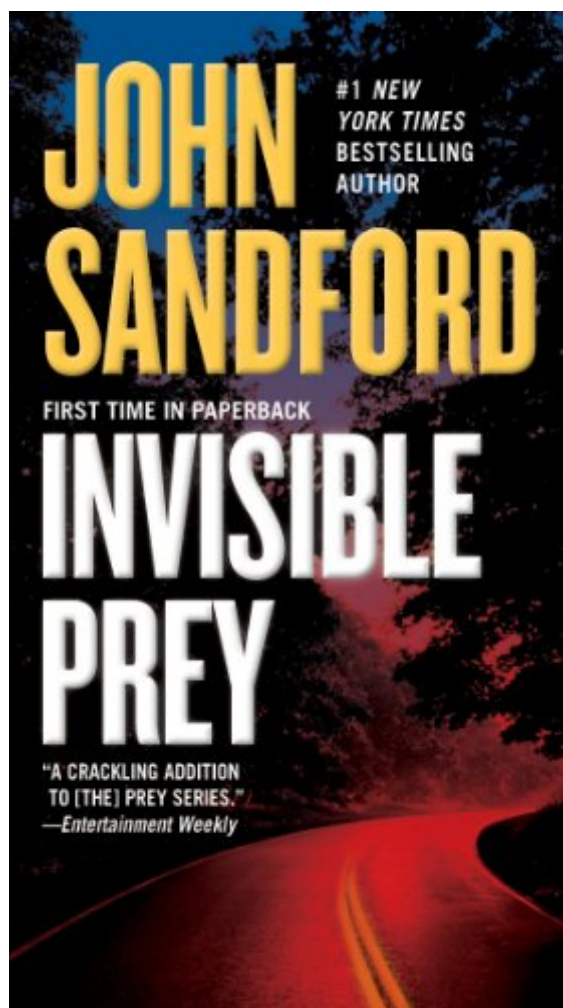


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Invisible Prey (The Prey Series Book 17)

I am slowly working my way to the entire series which I started years ago in the middle when I bought a paperback in the airport. Kindle makes it easy to find and manage a series by an author. Strong language so not for teenagers and below. They made only one of his books into a TV movie Certain Prey with Mark Harmon who is too "clean" to play Lucas Davenport. The killers are always

violent - must be the Minnesota winters - and remind me of the movie Fargo. Sanford doesn't have the flair of James Lee Burke but he is more prolific and always a good read even though he reveals the murderer(s) mid-way in the books. Now it's just a question of how Davenport will figure it out and what tricks he will use.

Not the most exciting book for me, I think I like it better when the author keeps the identity of the killer secret and throws some red herrings your way. Or, if the killer is known, it's a really interesting character (Clara Rinker, Louis Vullion). In this book, we know who the killer(s) are pretty early, and they aren't even remotely interesting... just some greedy sociopaths who mostly kill for practical reasons.

I really enjoyed the content of this book. It was quite different than the usual detective/mystery story. Another reason I really liked it was he finally introduced that "f_____ flowers!" I think I'm gonna love that character! Wasn't too impressed by the ending, for me it just didn't have that Sanford "KICK!" Maybe next time!
