

Collins Ireland: Handy Road Atlas 2015*** (International Road Atlases)



Synopsis

A wealth of tourist information, extremely clear and attractive mapping, and detailed town center plans make this an essential purchase for visitors. With attractive road mapping of the whole of Ireland at a scale of 5.2 miles to 1 inch, these maps feature layer colors to show land height and have a wide range of places of tourist interest plotted. This revised edition includes fully indexed large scale town and city center street plans of Dublin, Belfast, Cork, Limerick, Londonderry (Derry), Galway, Bangor, Waterford, Dun Laoghaire, Drogheda, and Killarney. There is also a places of interest section with descriptions and photographs. Other features include a route planning map of the whole of Ireland at 15.8 miles to 1 inch; clearly marked locations of fixed speed cameras and speed enforcement zones; tourist information centers, complete with addresses and telephone numbers; a distance chart; and a county map. Road distances are marked in both miles and kilometers.

Well done but we didn't use it on our October trip because all you need is Google Maps, which we never would have guessed. Just bring your mobile phone from the U.S. and keep it on Airplane Mode so no roaming charges. Then from Dooley car rental rent a Mi-Fi unit, which is basically a portable router. Got us around the entire country, even through desolate areas and tiny towns.

I ordered this map at the last minute because I couldn't get the other Collins Road Atlas in time for our trip. This map was perfect, we navigated all over Ireland with it. I don't understand the one star rating it got because we were able to drive from Dublin all the way across the country and back and stopped at many towns we had planned to see. It was also easy to transport because it is not thick.

This is not a road atlas. It's a thin, magazine of low-detail maps. This is not suitable for country drives around Ireland.

This little gem got me through my driving adventures in Ireland and Northern Ireland! Without GPS and cellphone reception, my friend and I would have never found our way without our trust Collins. Granted, many times the Irish roads are not physically labeled, so we still missed a few turns, but that was not the fault of this atlas. In fact, whenever we missed an unmarked turn, Collins helped us get back on our way or find a fun, out of the way route back to the main roads. I am DEFINITELY glad I had this with me when I braved being an American driver over there. Worth every penny.

THIS ONE IS THE BEST!! The size of the book and maps are great. The book is divided into sections which are numbered and shown on the back of the book. There is a legend and index that makes it very easy to locate your areas of interest. If I'm looking for something I find the town in the index which tells me the page number and area to locate. Example page 32 4C. The font for names of cities and towns is large enough to see without a magnifying glass. I previously purchased a fold out map that was terrible! This atlas is the best!

This has got to be the very best road atlas that I've ever bought. The scale is terrific; 1:328,000 (1" = 5.2 miles or 1 cm = 3.28 km). The pages aren't cluttered with too much information and it's easy to read and find what you're looking for. I had a Michelin map when I traveled in Germany and it was terrible. They tried to cram way too much stuff on a page and it was very difficult to find the town you were looking for. Bar none, I think Collins does the road maps better than anyone else.

Would have liked more of a full map. Have to keep changing pages, plus the map set up was all over the place. It would have been a lot easier to read if the map was concurrent, and if you were in the south, each page next would take over -instead you had to flip thru 2-3 pages to find the next travel area in that region

Drove around Ireland for 18 days, used this road atlas every day, indispensable. Just the right size. I also had purchased a full size map, but didn't need it as this atlas shows enough detail, and combined with a GPS, we stayed on track (almost) all the time. Highly recommended for anyone traveling to Ireland and planning to tour by car.

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
